### **Guidelines for Authors**

The article should not exceed 10 pages.

**Language:** Submissions are accepted only in English but an abstract in the language of the author is appreciated.

**Format:** Manuscripts should be submitted in Microsoft Word format, written with 12 font size, Times New Roman and double space. It should be written at A4 page and the margins should be 1.5 inches from the top, bottom and both sides of each page.

Additional illustrations and pictures should be given as separated files (jpg, tif...).

**Title Page:** The title should be accurate and short. The names of the authors, where they work and open address of the corresponding author should be mentioned. Every contribution should contain the additional biographical statements of the participating authors (short version in few sentences).

**Abstract:** Abstract should be no more than 200 words. It should be typed on a single page by itself. It should be brief, informative and reflect the content of the article. If it is the abstract of a research report, it should contain the aim, method, results of the study and conclusions.

**Keywords:** There should be about four keywords.

**References:** Within the text, citations should be made with the author's surname and the year of publication. References should be listed alphabetically by using APA style. Each reference contains author name or names, publication date, title of the work and publication data.

### **Review of the Manuscripts:**

All submitted manuscripts will be reviewed by at least two experts.
