1. Introduction

***Continuing Professional Development (CPD)** is the ongoing process of developing, maintaining, and documenting your professional skills, knowledge, and development. CPD is mandatory for all Certified Positive Psychotherapists or European Certified Positive Psychotherapists) and all Basic and Master Trainers. Positive - Psychotherapists and PPT trainers must continually update and develop their knowledge and skills. This commitment demonstrates and ensures professional competence, high standards, good quality service, and accountability for the public.*

Continuous Professional Development (CPD) is mandatory for re-registration as a **Positive Psychotherapist** and for holders of **Basic and Master Trainer** certificates within the **World Association for Positive and Transcultural Psychotherapy (WAPP)**. It ensures that professionals continue developing their skills, updating their knowledge, and adhering to high psychotherapy practice standards.

WAPP requires CPD in compliance with the European Association for Psychotherapy (EAP). According to the European Association for Psychotherapy (EAP)¹, CPD is a fundamental aspect of professional practice that upholds quality standards, ethical competence, and ongoing self-reflection. It encompasses structured and self-directed learning activities contributing to professional excellence and lifelong learning.

2. CPD Requirements

- Continuous Professional Development is mandatory for all **full members** of WAPP
- **Psychotherapists:** Required to complete 250 CPD credits over five years (50 credits per year).
- **Trainers (Basic and Master):** Required to complete 350 CPD credits over five years (250 CPD credits for psychotherapy + an additional 100 CPD credits for trainer activities).
- Not more than **30% of total CPD credits** can be accumulated from a single activity category.
- The first CPD reporting period started in **September 2024** and will end in **August 2029**.
- CPD credits can be added at **any time** throughout the five years.
- All CPD activities must be recorded in the **WAPP CPD Activity Log** and submitted via the WAPP Membership Portal.
- Associate members (Basic Consultants) and Supportive members are not required to complete CPD credits.

3. Reporting and Submission Process

- **Where to report:** CPD credits must be logged via the WAPP Member Portal (<https://wapp.member365.org/>).
- **How to report:** See the video guide: [YouTube](#) **Please use English to submit your activities, if needed use an online translation tool.**
- **Deadline:** CPD reports must be submitted every five years by the end of the reporting period.
- **Ongoing Submission:** CPD activities can be recorded and submitted **at any time** during the five years.
- **Required format:** Documents must be uploaded as **PDF files**.
- **Verification:** All activities must be supported by appropriate documentation, such as certificates, signed logs, or publication links.
- **Audit:** WAPP may conduct random audits to verify CPD submissions and ensure compliance.

4. CPD Activities

The following activities qualify for CPD credits. Each activity must be appropriately documented.

4.1. CPD Activities for Psychotherapists

4.2. CPD Activities for Trainers

(These CPD credits are added to the CPD credits required for psychotherapists)

WAPP requires Continuous Professional Development (CPD) for trainers to maintain the quality level of training around the world. You are required to complete the CPD for psychotherapists and to add an average of 20 credits per year of CPD for trainers.

5. Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

1. What kind of documentation is needed to certify supervision hours or self-discovery activities?

- Supervision hours require a **signed supervision record** from your supervisor detailing the date, duration, and topics covered. For peer supervision, entries should be recorded in a logbook and confirmed by peers.
- Self-discovery activities (individual/group therapy) require a **certificate or confirmation letter** from your therapist.

2. Can trainers issue their own CPD confirmations for their students? If so, in what format?

- Trainers can issue confirmations for their students only if explicitly recognized or authorized by WAPP. Such confirmations must be documented formally, typically as certificates or letters clearly stating the activity type, dates, duration, and the trainer's credentials.

3. If I am a trainer or organizer and conduct an activity that qualifies as a WAPP CPD activity, do I need to include any specific wording on the certificates?

- No, it is not mandatory to include any special wording on the certificates. It is sufficient to provide confirming documents such as a certificate of attendance or a confirmation letter, as outlined in the CPD activities table. These documents should clearly indicate: 1) who participated in the activity, 2) who conducted it, 3) the topic covered, 4) the type of activity, and 5) the number of hours and type (for theory, self-discovery, or supervision).
- However, if you are organizing a PPT-related conference that the WAPP Head Office officially approves to provide CPD credits, then, after receiving a positive response, you may add a note about CPD recognition by WAPP on the certificates.
- It is highly beneficial—though not obligatory—to issue certificates with key information also written in **English**, in addition to your local language. This will help ensure clarity and international recognition, especially when documents are reviewed by WAPP or used in international contexts.

4. Do CPD activities need to be completed every year, or is it acceptable to fulfill them within the five years?

- CPD activities do **not need to be evenly completed every year**. You can accumulate CPD credits at any time within the specified five-year reporting period (250 CPD credits for psychotherapists and 350 CPD credits for trainers over five years).

5. Can participation in supervision or self-discovery in other psychotherapy modalities count towards CPD credits?

- Yes, participation in supervision or self-discovery in other psychotherapy modalities may qualify if they are related to psychodynamic approaches and properly documented.

6. What is the process for obtaining CPD recognition for self-organized conferences or events?

- To obtain CPD recognition for self-organized events, organizers must:
 - Ensure the event topic relates to Positive Psychotherapy (PPT) or Psychodynamic Psychotherapy.
 - Include speakers who are WAPP members and Positive Psychotherapy practitioners.
 - Submit the conference program with speaker details to the WAPP Head Office (wapp@positum.org) at least **4 weeks before the event** for approval.

7. Are there restrictions on how many credits can come from self-directed learning, such as writing books or reviewing research papers?

- Yes, no single activity category can exceed **30% of the total required CPD credits** within a reporting period.

8. How can I verify that WAPP recognizes an external training, workshop, or conference for CPD credits?

- External trainings or workshops must be directly relevant to psychotherapy and preferably psychodynamic or PPT-related. You should ensure that the event provides an official attendance certificate or documentation, specifying hours completed. For formal verification, you can consult the WAPP Head Office or check the list of recognized institutions or programs on the WAPP Member Portal.

9. If I accumulate more than the required credits in one five-year period, can I transfer them to the next period?

- CPD credits accumulated beyond the required amount within five years **cannot be transferred** to the next reporting period unless explicitly stated otherwise by WAPP guidelines.

10. How do I ensure my CPD credits are counted for attending a psychotherapy conference not organized by WAPP?

- Ensure you obtain an official certificate of attendance clearly indicating the number of hours attended. Log this activity in your CPD Activity Log and upload the documentation through the WAPP Member Portal.
- If the event was registered via the WAPP Member Portal and your attendance was confirmed, the CPD credits may be assigned to your account automatically, and there is no need to submit certificates manually. You can check whether the credits have been assigned by logging into your personal account and reviewing the CPD module.

11. Can CPD credits be awarded for mentorship or peer-to-peer training?

- Mentorship or peer-to-peer training can qualify under supervision or peer support categories if properly documented, confirmed by peers, and aligned with psychodynamic or PPT methods. Check specific conditions with WAPP if in doubt.

12. If the article/book is co-authored, are CPD credits divided?

- Yes, CPD credits are divided among co-authors. For example, a sole author of a journal article or book receives the full 15 credits. If there are multiple authors, the credits are shared proportionally — e.g., in a co-authored article with two authors, each would receive 8 credits; with three authors, each would receive 5 credits, etc. The same rule applies to book co-authorship.

13. Do trainers receive CPD credits for conducting training sessions, supervision, or self-discovery groups within WAPP programs?

- No, trainers do not receive CPD credits for conducting regular training sessions, supervision, or self-discovery groups within official WAPP programs (Basic, Master, or Specialised courses). Continuous Professional Development (CPD) refers to activities that contribute to the trainer’s own professional growth beyond their regular responsibilities. Delivering training as part of one’s regular role is not eligible for CPD credits. However, participation in additional training activities (e.g., external seminars, workshops, or advanced programs) may be counted.

14. Can specialized courses provide CPD credits for both participants and trainers?

- Yes, specialized courses can provide CPD credits for both participants and trainers, as long as these courses are related to Positive Psychotherapy (PPT) or Psychodynamic Psychotherapy, have accredited trainers or facilitators, and provide official certificates or confirmations of participation.

15. If I am a Basic Consultant, do I need to complete any CPD credits?

- No, Basic Consultants are considered associate members and are **not required to complete CPD credits**.

16. Can attending any psychotherapy conference be counted toward CPD credits?

- Yes, all psychotherapy conferences, irrespective of psychotherapeutic modality, can count toward CPD credits. Ensure that you have an official certificate stating clearly the number of hours attended.

17. I want to organize a conference. Can I receive CPD credits from WAPP? What are the requirements?

- Yes, you can receive CPD credits from WAPP for organizing a conference, provided you:
 - Ensure the conference topics relate explicitly to Positive Psychotherapy (PPT) or Psychodynamic Psychotherapy.
 - Involve WAPP members as speakers or workshop leaders.
 - Submit the conference program and speaker details to WAPP Head Office (wapp@positum.org) at least **4 weeks before the event** for official approval.
